Transportation Infrastructure

The Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) has engaged in a variety of partnerships to develop transportation infrastructure and improve interconnectivity throughout the country. These projects, which include road, rail, air, maritime, and river and lake infrastructure, are providing coordinated pathways to move commodities and people throughout the central African region.

Quick Stats:

Road Network

- 152,400 km of road including urban roadways, and access to local interest or agricultural pathways
- The TRANSCO bus company helps connect citizens and visitors within Kinshasa

Railway Network

- 5,033 km of railway, connecting Katanga to Zambia, and Kisangani to Ubundu among others

Marine, River, and Lake Network

- Network stretches 16,238 km long, and incorporates the Matadi-Banana reach and the average reach of the Congo river. Also connects through the upper reach of the Lualaba and lakes.
- 40 river and lake ports equipped including Kinshasa, Ilebo, Kalemie, Kisangani, Mbandaka, Kindu, and Ubundu

Airway Network

- 270 airport facilities, including five international airports in Kinshasa, Lubumbashi, Kisangani, Goma, and Gbadolite

Upcoming Efforts:

- Develop a new public transport policy that unites efficiency, probability, and social needs using private investment to support these efforts.
- Strengthen the capacity of rolling stock and spare parts of public carriers by adding approximately 1,500 buses over the next five years.
- Create a national fund to promote public transport, funded by toll roads and public car parks in major cities.
